



What is HOG?

About 22 years ago, Harley Davidson created a factory sponsored riding club in response to Harley riders growing desire for an organised way to share their passion and show their pride. It was decided that the factory-sponsored club ought to be called the Harley Owners Group, with the nickname HOG. This seemed most appropriate, since Harleys had been referred to as Hogs from the earliest days. The club was launched and, as they say, the rest is history. It was a small start, but from that day membership has grown so that today there are over 900,000 members worldwide and it is the largest factory-sponsored motorcycle club in the world.

If you click onto the Harley-Davidson web site, www.harley-davidson.com and scroll down under HOG, the opening banner boasts this query: "Who says you can't choose your family?" A valid question and the response would be that members of HOG really do consider themselves extended family members. And if you are part of HOG's growing numbers, welcome aboard!

The truism that humans really long to be part of something greater than themselves is evident in the appeal of an organisation like HOG. Add to all that the Chapter activities and you have a gigantic worldwide family that shares its enthusiasm through this terrific organisation.
